


# Why a Postsecondary Credential is Essential

Without a college degree, a child born into a poor family has little chance of breaking into the upper end of the income distribution.

# **Talent, Innovation, Equity States**

- Up to \$500,000 over two years

- Common state expectations: data collection and reporting, diverse stakeholder leadership group
